

## **TYPES OF INCIDENTS**




Incidents can consist of several acts.

## VICTIM CHARACTERISTICS:




HATE-MOTIVATED INCIDENTS SINCE JANUARY 2025: 117

In November, Konjic hosted an interreligious dialogue with representatives from Islamic, Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant communities, alongside youth, schools, city officials, media, and the Peacebuilding Konjic coalition. The event advanced the Community Cohesion Action Plan, which strengthens interfaith dialogue by promoting coexistence and youth engagement, reinforcing the commitment to inclusive community building.
