Highlighted

In August, with support from Nevesinje Municipality, the Nevesinje Coalition against Hate organized the removal of offensive graffiti and the painting of murals portraying the late actor Nebojša Glogovac. The idea is to remove all offensive and inappropriate graffiti and messages from the public space, replacing them with murals conveying positive messages, strengthening local ownership, and social cohesion.

The Hate Monitor provides an update on all potential hate-motivated incidents and responses known to the OSCE Mission to BiH at the time of publishing the report
